I understand how busy family life becomes, but keeping school as a priority will help guarantee success. It is always a good idea to eliminate distractions while your child works, so finding a quiet place and eliminating screen time is helpful. Habits they form in middle school will stay with them through high school and beyond. Organization, finding a routine, studying, and being willing to ask for help are key. Education always works best when the school and the family work together, so don't be afraid to contact your child's teacher if you have questions, concerns, or are just seeking feedback.

As we progress deeper into the fall, a valuable tradition is on the horizon. On Wednesday, November 9th, (and throughout the week) we will honor Veterans Day. We have always honored our veterans in a great way at Northwood. Also, the fall brings concerts, sports, and new activity opportunities. We have had a great start to the 22-23 school year thanks to the work of your students, Mead staff, and parent/guardian support. In an effort to do our best partnering with our community, the middle school admin teams would like to remind families the most efficient way to solve any problems that may arise during the school year. Please read the message below that provides the best pathway to meet student and family needs when issues or concerns arise.

Thank you, Mead Middle School Admin Team

As part of a district-wide administrative group, we collectively work to make sure our parents and students get the highest quality education we can provide. It's not uncommon for families to have questions or want to gain a deeper understanding of the curriculum and instructional materials their child's teachers are using. Additionally, it is imperative that our teachers and administrators are able to work together with our families through processes defined by Board policies to be able to review materials and address any concerns that arise.

As shared by district administration at the September 12th school board meeting, when concerns arise in the classroom, the first step for parents/guardians is to contact the child's teacher to work through resolving an issue. If communication or meetings between the teacher and parent/guardian do not resolve the concern, the next step is to contact the school's grade level administrator, then the principal. From there, if the concern remains unresolved after contact with the principal, the District's Director of Elementary Education Rob Haugen or Director of Secondary Education Darren Nelson should be contacted to bring all parties together to discuss a plan for resolution. Working through this process will ensure that parents/guardians have the tools and opportunity to be heard.

NEXT UP: 7/8 Volleyball & 6/7/8 Wrestling Start Oct. 24:

Please register your student-athlete on FamilyID, which is found under the "Activities" tab on our website. Our registration numbers determine our game/practice schedules, coaching positions, and how we can utilize our facilities.

Fees include: ASB \$15, Participation \$35, Spirit Pack \$25 (football, softball, baseball only). Fees can be paid at the business office or online through TouchBase, which can be found on the "Quick Links" under the "Our School" tab.

If your child does not have a physical, please get it scheduled as soon as possible. Physicals are good for 2 years, be sure to have an update & provide a copy to the Northwood Business Office before the first day of practice. Athletes with incomplete paperwork or unpaid fees two school days prior to the start of the season WILL NOT be able to begin practice until completed and could lose the ability to participate for a portion or all of the season.

After School Activity Buses:

Activity buses will be available for athletes that need a ride after practices. Bus pick-up time at Northwood will be at 5:00pm. Failure to comply or other misconduct will result in loss of activity bus privileges.
