MIDDLE SCHOOL SPORTS MATTER!

Check out our Athletics Website and Athletic Calendar for updates for all sports, as well as access to a variety of important resources and information. Please note that schedules can change as games are affected by weather, COVID related issues, and other conflicts.

8th BASKETBALL Starts February 14th - Registration is Open

Please register your student-athlete on FamilyID, which is found under the "Activities" tab on our website. Our registration numbers determine our game/practice schedules, coaching positions, and how we can utilize our facilities.

Athletes with incomplete paperwork or unpaid fees two school days prior to the start of the season WILL NOT be able to begin practice until completed and could lose the ability to participate for a portion or all of the season.

If your child does not have a physical (good for 2 years), please get it scheduled & provide a copy to the Northwood Business Office before the first day of practice.

Fees include: ASB \$15 & Participation \$35. Fees can be paid at the business office or online through TouchBase, which can be found on the "Quick Links" under the "Our School" tab.

COVID Testing for 8th Basketball - 2022

Basketball is considered a high contact indoor sport. All athletes, regardless of vaccination status, will need to be tested on game days in order to participate in basketball. The testing schedule will be communicated as changes in testing requirements take place. In order to be tested, ALL athletes must have the testing registration and a testing consent form completed. The form can be found on the district

COVID Testing website and on our Athletics website. Please make sure this is completed prior to the start of the season.

Regardless of vaccination status, all athletes will be required to wear a mask at all times during practices. They can remove their mask when they are on the floor during a game.

Athletes that have had COVID will need to have clearance from their doctor allowing them to participate unless their infection took place prior to their sports physical. These athletes will not be required to test for COVID the first 90 days after the date of their infection.

After School Activity Buses Must Be Reserved

Activity buses will be available for athletes that need a ride after practices. Pick-up time at Northwood will be at 5:00pm. All athletes must wear a mask. Failure to comply or other misconduct will result in loss of activity bus privileges. If you need to register for the activity bus, please complete the Registration Survey. PLEASE DO NOT PARK IN THE BACK BUS LOOP/FIRE LANE AT ANY TIME FOR ANY REASON OTHER THAN AN EMERGENCY.
